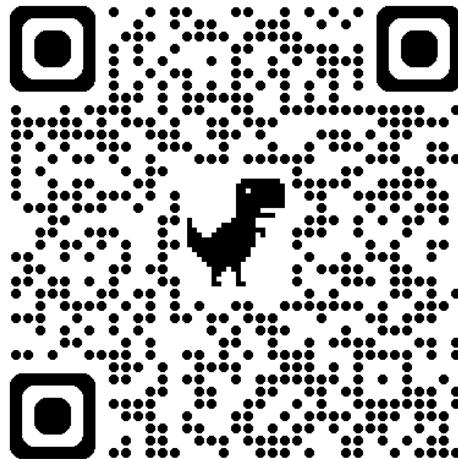

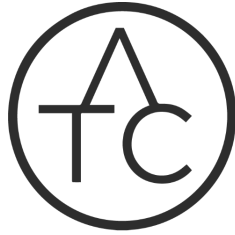

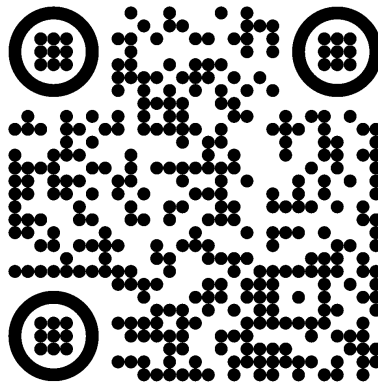

**Bustang Outrider is a commercial bus service. The “Outrider” has routes to and from the San Luis Valley and all over the state. Bus Stops in the Valley and nearby are “Alamosa Stop 1” at Adams State University, 1603 First St.; and “Alamosa Stop 2” at Loaf ‘n Jug, 102 W. U.S. Hwy 160 at Hwy. 17; and Moffat Town Park at 5th Street and Reynolds Avenue in Moffat; and Poncha Springs (Salida area) at Poncha Market, 6250 US HWY 285; and Salida Chaffee Shuttle at 54 Jones Ave. in Salida (about 1/4 mile East of 50 Burger on North side of the road). This “Alamosa to Pueblo” route also stops in Cotopaxi, Penrose, Pueblo West and the Pueblo Transit Center in downtown Pueblo. The “Durango to Grand Junction” route has stops in Bayfield, Durango, Ridgeway and Montrose. The Trinidad to Pueblo route has a stop in Walsenburg at 400 Main St. and Aguilar at 146 W. Main St. but there is no route listed from Alamosa to Fort Garland/ Blanca or Walsenburg. Purchase tickets by downloading the Bustang Outrider app to your phone or call 800-900-3011 for more information. You cannot purchase tickets on the website. To get to Denver, use the “Alamosa to Pueblo” route and then in Salida (at Chaffee Shuttle) switch buses to the “Crested Butte to Denver” route. The website and app have routes, maps, schedules and fares. Routes, times and fares may change! Sign up for text alerts or follow @bustangoutrider. For questions on the Alamosa to Pueblo route call 719-545-8900. Tickets are always half-price for the disabled, children 11 and younger and those 65 or older.**

An outpatient program, Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) can cut down on the amount of time you'll need to invest in recovery. It also eliminates much of the withdrawal symptoms associated with early recovery, so patients may pursue treatment in relative comfort. 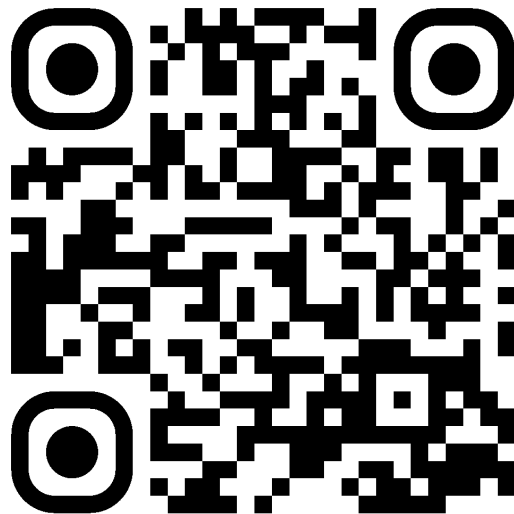

Visitors receive a pre-packed box of food for each program, if eligible, which includes a variety of shelf-stable staples and generally includes refrigerated cheese or frozen meat or produce.**

Domestic violence includes intimate partner violence, as well as situations where people abuse their children, parents, siblings, other relatives, and even roommates. Domestic abuse is relatively common: it affects 10 million people in the United States each year. About 1 in 3 women and 1 in 10 men are victims of domestic violence. Domestic violence can look like digital or online abuse, financial abuse, physical abuse, sexual abuse, mental abuse, and emotional abuse.

**SLV Transportation/Red Willows provides 24/7/365 non-emergency medical transportation to our deserving clients. We can take you anywhere in the state. Services include medical and non-medical transportation. We accept private pay clients, and Medicaid or Worker's Compensation payment but you must call us or come in to check your eligibility. If you are eligible, then you need to be certified by your own primary care physician. The Primary Care Physician must be established in the San Luis Valley. Medicaid requires that the clients see the nearest Medicaid Provider to be eligible for transportation. This paperwork must be filled out by a Primary Care Physician and the client. (Paperwork consists of the Certification sheet, nearest provider form, consent form and HIPPA form). Human escorts and certified service animals may accompany the client if we are notified when you make your appointment for transportation. Our Street Outreach works with community members living on the streets and other places that tend to be transitional within the San Luis Valley. We offer distribution days at St. Benedict's Encampment and other locations around the Valley, during which we ensure unsheltered individuals receive clothing, food, water, camping gear, propane, and other items needed for tougher living situations. We also offer case management to help connect unsheltered individuals to various resources and provide an advocating voice.

**Supplies:** We always have:

- High protein food
- Canned food (beans, soup, tuna, chicken)
- Water

It depends on donations so we can't guarantee availability, but we often have\*:

- Hygiene supplies (shampoo, soap, razors, toothpaste)
- Limited bike supplies (sealant and bike tubes)
- Clothing (shoes, jackets, socks, underwear, and shirts)
- Warm weather gear (blankets, hot hands, gloves, and beanies)
- Small 16oz green propane cans
- Large 20lb propane tank refills\*\*
- Tarps and tents\*\*

\*\*We can only supply tents once every six months and can only provide large propane tank refills once a month during the winter months. For these items, we will log your name and the date to keep track of when you are eligible for another tent/refill.

**The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) is a nutrition and food assistance program that provides nutritious groceries, nutrition education, breastfeeding support, and other services free of charge. To qualify for WIC in Colorado, you must live in Colorado and be pregnant, a mother of a breastfeeding baby under 1 year of age, a new mother who had a baby or was pregnant in the past 6 months, or you have a baby or child younger than 5 years. Fathers, grandparents, or any caregiver of a child under 5 years of age may apply for WIC for their child. You may apply for WIC if you are working or unemployed. 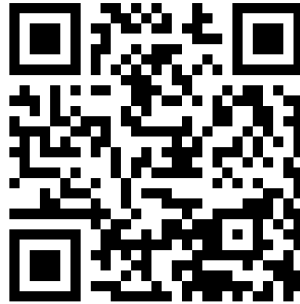
**The San Luis Valley Area Health Education Center (SLV AHEC) provides services to six counties in the San Luis Valley: Alamosa, Conejos, Costilla, Mineral, Rio Grande, and Saguache counties, an area of over 8,000 square miles. The SLV AHEC was established in 1978 as a community-based 501(c)(3) organization, and is one of six regional independent AHECs in Colorado that serve the entire state. The SLV AHEC is affiliated with the University of Colorado's Anschutz Medical Campus AHEC Program Office, which partners with the SLV AHEC to administer the HRSA Model AHEC grant.**
